## **Product Description**

Anti-TAZ is produced in rabbit using as immunogen a synthetic peptide corresponding to residues 386-400 [VESALNKSEPFLTWL] of human WWTR1 (GeneID 25937). The antibody is affinity-purified.

Anti-TAZ recognizes human TAZ. Applications include the detection of TAZ by immunoblotting (~49 kDa) and immunohistochemistry.

A novel transcriptional co-activator, TAZ (transcriptional co-activator with PDZ-binding motif) functions as a 14-3-3-binding molecule. Highly conserved and ubiquitously expressed 14-3-3 proteins regulate differentiation, cell cycle progression and apoptosis by binding intracellular phosphoproteins involved in signal transduction. TAZ may link events at the plasma membrane and cytoskeleton to nuclear transcription in a manner that can be regulated by 14-3-3.

### Reagent

Supplied as a solution in phosphate buffered saline, containing 0.02% sodium azide.

Antibody concentration: ~1.0 mg/mL

# Storage/Stability

For continuous use, store at 2-8 °C for up to three months. For extended storage, freeze in working aliquots. Repeated freezing and thawing, or storage in "frost-free" freezers, is not recommended.

<u>Immunoblotting</u>: a working dilution of 1:500-1:1,000 is recommended.

<u>Immunohistochemistry</u>: an optimal working antibody dilution should be determined.

**Note**: In order to obtain the best results using various techniques and preparations, we recommend determining the optimal working dilutions by titration.
