
Atto 620 belongs to a new generation of fluorescent labels for the red spectral region. The dye is designed for application in the area of life science, e.g. labeling of DNA, RNA or proteins. Characteristic features of the label are strong absorption, temperature dependent fluorescence, high thermal and photo-stability, and very little triplet formation. Atto 620 is a cationic dye. After coupling to a substrate the dye carries a net electrical charge of $^{+1}$.

The label is moderately hydrophilic. In common with most Atto-labels, absorption and fluorescence are independent of pH, at least in the range of pH 2 to 11, used in typical applications.
